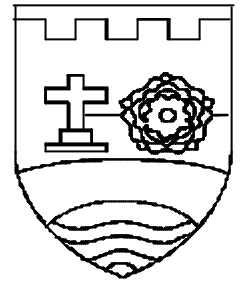

Village Green



The project to improve the seating and noticeboard areas on the Village Green is now virtually complete.

LOTTERY FUNDED

The old concrete slabs for the seating area at the front of The Green have been replaced with Indian stone, and all that remains is for a couple of seats to be added. A block paved path has been laid to the seating area



at the rear of The Green. The work, with a total cost of £6600, was part funded by a grant of £3600 from Awards for All, for which we are extremely grateful and our thanks also go to Steve Wignall and his workers for an excellent job.



Sadly the new seating areas have, at times, attracted groups of young (and not so young) adults at rather unsociable times of the night. Our local Community Policing

Team will be monitoring the area closely.

Competition Entries

The Council has, once again, entered the village into the 2009 North West in Bloom and Lancashire Best Kept Village competitions.

Following an article in the March newsletter inviting residents to join a 'Croston in Bloom Group' to plan and oversee this year's entry a number of residents attended an initial meeting on April 1st 2009. A group of volunteers has been formed to help improve the appearance of the village and, hopefully, increase our chances of winning the North West in Bloom Competition this year. Croston Residents Environment Workforce (CREW) are looking at parts of the village which need a bit of TLC.

Annual Report of Croston Parish Council

The main role of the Parish Council is to support the residents of Croston by raising a variety of issues with the relevant authorities. To further these links the Chairman and Clerk have attended Lancashire Local meetings and Borough/Parish Liaison meetings.

We have continued to deploy the Speed Indicator Device (SpID), bought in partnership with Heskin and Bretherton Parish Councils, at our 3 sites around the village on a rota basis.

With the help of a grant of £3,600 from Awards for All, works to improve the Village Green have been undertaken to improve access to the seating areas.

The Parish Council received several requests for grant funding during the year and was pleased to support the Bowland Pennine Mountain Rescue Team, North West Air Ambulance, Victim Support Lancashire, Croston Village Festivities Group, Croston Community Centre and Croston Old School.

Once again the Council entered the village in 2 competitions, Lancashire Best Kept Village and North West in Bloom, in which we were placed 3rd in our category. The Council would like to express their thanks to all residents who voluntarily help with the care and maintenance of the floral displays around the village and John and Annabelle Pearson who have, once again, secured a wonderful donation of plants from Michael Coxhead (Coxhead Nurseries) for the river wall on Town Road. .

The Council continues to employ the Clerk, Alan Platt, who provides valuable advice and supports the council through his diligent work. Kevin Greenhalgh has also continued to work conscientiously as the Village Lengthsman.

Thanks go to Clive Barbour who, with his co-workers, has maintained the Village Green and several other grass areas to a high standard.

The quarterly newsletter produced by the Parish Council has continued to keep residents informed on matters of relevance to the village.

Blue Bin

The blue bins should, by now, be with us and it seems like a good opportunity to remind residents of what to place in them - glass bottles and jars (all colours), empty plastic bottles like pop, water, milk, shampoo, household cleaning products, **(the type of plastic we can recycle is usually marked with a recycle logo and numbers 1, 2 or 3)** and all metal food and drink cans, and metal foil. Please rinse out bottles and cans (you can leave labels on) and squash them if you're short of space.

Mindless vandalism continues to be a problem in the village.

The perspex sheet on the new noticeboard outside the Police Station was smashed within 2 weeks of it being put up and both the other noticeboards on the Village Green and on the Co-op have suffered similar damage. Also 2 more litter bins have been stolen from the Recreation Ground Play Area. These costs are paid direct from the Council's precept. It is the residents of the village who pick up the bill via council tax.

There has been an increase in push bike thefts in the area, some have been left unattended and insecure and some have been stolen from garages and sheds. Please ensure your bike is secure and has adequate markings to identify it should it be stolen. If you require your bikes to be cycle coded, please contact us on the numbers below.

We seem to have an even bigger problem with double parking throughout the village. Unfortunately the roads of Croston were not designed for the amount of traffic that now uses them and there is no longer a right to park outside your own house. If there is no space available then you will have to find somewhere else - please do not block the pavements or double park. If the problem continues then we will have no option than to issue penalty notices and, in some circumstances, have the vehicles removed.

There has been a small improvement with dog fouling through the village but it continues to be a problem. Extra patrols with the Police and Council will continue in an effort to clean up the village and people found to be committing offences will be issued with £75 fines.
