

Community Flood Plan

The Parish Council is working alongside our partners at Chorley Council, the Environment Agency and the Emergency Services to provide a Flood Plan for the village.

Many residents may not be aware that the ultimate responsibility for the flood defence of a property lies with the owner/occupier and, in order to clarify this, and other issues, relating to flooding a public meeting has been arranged for 7.00pm, Wednesday 7 July 2010 at The Old School (for full details see the insert in this newsletter). All residents who may be affected by flooding, and anyone else who is interested, or may wish to help, are asked to come along.

Coffee Day 2010

We would like to remind residents that Town Road and Westhead Road (A581), and Station Road (B5247) will be closed to all vehicles on Saturday 3 July 2010 between 1.45pm and 4.15pm for the annual Croston Coffee Day Procession.

Highfield Road (A581) and Grape Lane/Syd Brook Lane will also be closed (except for access).

Vandalism

Mindless vandals have been 'enjoying' themselves smashing beer bottles on the Recreation Area and making fires inside the Youth Shelter. As a result of this we are arranging for the removal of the Youth Shelter in the near future.

Also one of the Heritage Trail noticeboards, on Grape Lane, was broken off its legs and pushed into the river. Fortunately the board was recovered and is awaiting repair.

Annual Report

The Parish Council continues to support the residents of Croston by raising a variety of issues with the relevant authorities. The Chairman and Clerk have attended Borough/Parish Liaison meetings and Councillors have attended Recreational Funding Seminars.

Problems have been experienced with the deployment of the Speed Indicator Device (SpID), bought in partnership with Heskin and Bretherton Parish Councils. Faults with the Device resulted in it spending quite a time at the manufacturers for repair and the bad winter weather meant it was unsuitable to deploy the device for safety reasons. We are happy to say these problems appear to be behind us and we will be deploying the SpID on a regular basis.

The Parish Council received several requests for grant funding during the year and was pleased to support the Bowland Pennine Mountain Rescue Team, North West Air Ambulance, Victim Support Lancashire, Croston Community Centre and Croston Old School.

Once again, the Council entered the village in two competitions, Lancashire Best Kept Village and North West in Bloom, in which we were placed joint 2nd in our category. The Council would like to express their thanks to all residents who voluntarily help with the care and maintenance of the floral displays around the village and John and Annabelle Pearson who have, once again, secured a wonderful donation of plants from Michael Coxhead (Coxhead Nurseries) for the river wall on Town Road.

The Council continues to employ the Clerk, Alan Platt, who provides advice and support to the council. Kevin Greenhalgh has also continued to work conscientiously as the Village Lengthsman, to the extent that the Village achieved the Tidy Britain Clean Sweep Award in the North West in Bloom Competition.

Thanks go to Clive Barbour and his Associates who have maintained the Village Green and several other grass areas to a high standard.

The Parish Council's quarterly newsletter has continued to inform residents on matters of relevance to the village and we intend to improve on this with the addition of a full colour sheet in this, and future, editions.

Flood Risk in Croston

Have your say in developing Croston's Flood Plan.

Parts of Croston are at risk of flooding and the Parish Council would like your help in developing a Community Flood Plan. This Plan will be a vital part of helping



our community prepare for flooding so that everyone knows what to do if flooding should happen.

The Parish Council is holding a meeting at 7.00pm on 7 July 2010 at The Old School, Church Street to discuss what preparing a community flood plan involves and what it should include. They will also explain how you can have a role in this.

Being involved in flood planning will enable your community to take control and help during a flood, when other organisations could be overstretched or unable to reach you. Communities that are involved in developing flood plans are more likely to be flood resilient.

A community flood plan will also help to improve communication before, during and after flooding, making sure the right people are involved at the right time.

The Environment Agency will be at the meeting to highlight which parts of Croston are at risk of flooding and to help in preparing the community flood plan. Chorley Council will also be there to offer help and advice and, even if your home isn't at risk of flooding, you can still be involved as you may be able to help others during a flood.

We hope you can come along to the meeting to find out how you can help to prepare your community, and your home, for flooding. 

We appear to be destined to lose the Weekly Trailer Library, which is due to be replaced by a fortnightly visit from the Mobile Library.

For the very keen readers Eccleston Library can be found in the Carrington Centre, The Green, Eccleston. If you are already a mobile library or trailer user, just bring your Lancashire Libraries card with you.

Otherwise - it's easy to join. Just come along and we can issue a card for you to take books out straight away. Phone 01257 451825 for information.

Also, if you need a bit of help to get online, or would like to keep in touch with family and friends via email or just need assistance to get confident on your computer we have a volunteer in the library on Wednesday mornings who can sit with you for a half hour session to show you how to get over these small problems. This is not a course but we can assist you to get your own email account and tackle things like online shopping, booking a holiday, job searching, family history, access to public services etc.

There is no charge for this service. You will need your library card or, if you haven't been before, staff will be happy to provide you with a membership to the library which will also enable you to use the other Library services.


