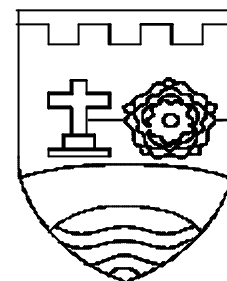

The Parish Council has reduced the Parish Precept by £130 for 2010-2011. Unfortunately, as a result of the formula used by Chorley Council, the amount payable by residents will remain unchanged. This formula takes into account expected receipts with allowances for reduced and non-payment, bad debt, empty, and new, properties etc and changes annually.

In the current financial climate we felt residents should be assisted wherever possible so, by careful budgeting, we have been able to manage this small reduction, following on from a zero increase last year, with no reductions in services provided by the Parish Council.

These services include the Village Lengthsman, who picks litter from the major routes through the village, ongoing maintenance of the Recreation Ground and Play Area and the Village Green, mowing of the Recreation Field and the Village Green and grass verges throughout the village. The Council also provides the Christmas lights on the Village Green and opposite the War Memorial, spring and summer planting of the tubs and beds around the village, wayside seats, our shared Speed Indicator Device, emptying of dog waste bins and the relevant public and employers liability insurance cover.

Additional funds will, again this year, be set aside for a major project to improve the Recreation Ground. We shall also be seeking grant funding towards this and, if we are unable to obtain funding, we will have to continue to build up funds over the coming years

## Calling all Artists!

The inaugural Croston Arts Festival on Sunday 25 April is looking for artists to take part in a showcase arts event that is hoped will become an annual feature in the village. The event is to help launch Creative Co-operative North West and has support from The Co-operative Group.

Events pencilled in include musical performances and art displays at Trinity Methodist Church and Meeting Room.

The Old School Hall will feature artwork from pupils from Bishop Rawstone and the feeder primary schools of Croston, Eccleston, Heskin, Wrightington and Rufford.

The festival will get under way around noon, with the official opening of a new walkway from the main road to the Croft, designed for wheelchair users.

Following the official opening, there will be the chance to view the pupils' work, as the school's orchestra and Galloways Society for the Blind Choir entertain.

It is also hoped to arrange for theatre and drama groups, circus performers, children's entertainers and musical acts in St Michaels Church grounds and arboretum, aimed at all age groups.

The Co-operative kitchen will be demonstrating seasonal themed cooking in the Community Centre.

Additionally there will be a craft fair and work across a spectrum of arts disciplines from photography to painting and pottery.

## Lancashire Constabulary

There have been several crimes recorded recently; several cars have been broken into whilst outside pubs in the area - all had expensive property on display - please do not leave valuable property in your car. Another incident was a bogus official burglary on a lady in the village. She answered the door and the man told her he was doing work next door and noticed her roof needed attention - he got into conversation with her and was allowed into the house. When she told him she wasn't interested he got quite aggressive towards her and she gave him money so he would leave. She was very frightened and lost £100's.

A word of warning with regards to a new con that is going around - a person contacts you by phone saying they are from the Council and that you've paid too much Council Tax and they need your bank details to put the money back. When they have your details they can empty your bank account. Please do not give any personal details to anyone over the phone. With both these messages in mind, Chorley Council has contracted a company to carry out surveys of their properties in the area. The company will contact you prior to the visit and will carry identification, they have also supplied the Police with details of all the people involved and can be verified if you are unsure. Please arrange to have someone with you when the company visit and if you are unsure who they are do not let them in and call the Police. If they are genuine they will not mind being checked out and if they are not, they will not hang around for the Police !!
